

Denise Cox Hits the High (and chilly) Seas With Steffen Peters

THANK YOU DENISE FOR SHARING THIS WITH US!!!!!



I have just returned from the 2024 Sporthorse Cruise to Alaska. One of the speakers was Olympic rider, Steffen Peters. What a privilege to meet this wonderful humble man... I would like to recap some of the information and the talk that I had with him... On our one on one, I asked about being raised in a Horse family... The answer was no, they had a vacation house Where are they road ponies... He and his sister got involved in pony club. His sister didn't continue with it but he did. My question was when did you know dressage was going to be your forte. He said from 1985 when he came to the United States I asked how he got the confidence to ride it higher levels. My own notes are a mess, but I wrote "standard of rideable, staying in front of the leg, horse must have self carriage and you continue to work at it. (I didn't take good notes on that one!). He has a contact in Germany that tells him about good potential mounts... They are usually eight years old or more and at third level at least... He has Talented riders at his farm that will school the horses, but they do not do upper level movements as he has his own buttons for the horse and it would confuse them... he practices one movement at a time, then a walking break another movement then a walking break... He said that is Paramount and keeping the horse fresh and not anticipating upcoming movements the habit or feature that is a no go when looking at horses to purchase is the mouth... The horse must accept the bit and not have tongue moving in and out or trying to get over the bit or very tough mouth... His favorite upper 1 level movement is the Piaffe. I asked if he took horses to schooling shows or just does he go to rated shows only he said he may take a horse for exposure and not ride just have them in the warm-up arena, but by the time he gets the horses they have traveled and they have been schooled... His most admired Horseman was Carl Hester. He shares the same love for the animal and puts the welfare of the horse first.

I donated to the club for the NFDA grooming towels for everyone in the group. He was thrilled and asked about one for his groom and his wife. He showed pictures of all the Olympics and his horses. He gets up at 5 to go the barn, goes the gym for a workout. His wife is a great cook and he loves her cooking. I asked about riding other elite rider's horses, and he said no. Each rider has their own way of going and at the movements they ask for, there should be no confusion for the horse. I asked if any of the horses have best buddies and companions like sheep that they bring with them. He laughed and said if they travel side by side whether in a plane or trailer, they become best friends and will spend the day calling for each other. He said Mopsie is now at the owner's farm retired but the owner's daughters enjoy riding him. I said you need a tall ladder to get on him at 18.2 hands. Steffen has the greatest respect for his groom, Eddie. He said the venues will now post not only the name of the horse and rider but also include the groom's name. There is not a false pretense about him. I also asked if he had been approached to develop his own lifestyle me of tack with his name. He said he had.

I wanted to add a little more about my talk with Steffen Peters... He said to imagine vaulting in the connection from the line to the horse... It is light. It is not tight, but the contact is there. Imagine pure suppleness. Advice for nerves: "watch your thoughts! The quality of your thoughts affect you riding, your horse and into your own life."

HIPPOLOGY NATIONALS 2024 WAS A BLAST! HUGE THANKS TO THE NFDA FOR THE SCHOLARSHIP THAT HELPED MAKE IT POSSIBLE FOR ME TO ATTEND BOTH NATIONALS AND REGIONALS THIS YEAR. HIPPOLOGY WAS HIGHLY COMPETITIVE. WITH INCREDIBLY HARDWORKING CONTESTANTS. HIPPOLOGY CONSISTS OF FOUR PHASES: A TIMED WRITTEN EXAM (150 QUESTIONS), A SLIDES PORTION (50 SLIDES), STATIONS (100 QUESTIONS ON HORSE-RELATED TOPICS), HORSE JUDGING (PLACING FOUR CLASSES OF PERFORMANCE AND HALTER HORSES), AND A TEAM PROBLEM (AN IMPROMPTU PRESENTATION ON A GIVEN SCENARIO). MY INDIVIDUAL PLACINGS WERE: 5TH HIGH INDIVIDUAL OVERALL 4TH HIGH INDIVIDUAL IN WRITTEN TEST 8TH HIGH INDIVIDUAL IN JUDGING IN THE TEAM COMPETITION, WE DID INCREDIBLY WELL: 4TH OVERALL HIGH TEAM 7TH IN THE WRITTEN TEST 5TH IN STATIONS RESERVE HIGH TEAM IN JUDGING CHAMPION TEAM IN THE PROBLEM-SOLVING PHASE AT REGIONALS, IN JULY, MY TEAM AND I HAD GREAT RESULTS. I PLACED 4TH OVERALL, 3RD IN THE WRITTEN TEST, AND 10TH IN STATIONS, AND OUR TEAM EARNED 3RD OVERALL WITH STRONG PLACINGS IN MULTIPLE PHASES. THE KEY TO HIPPOLOGY, ESPECIALLY AT MULTI-STATE COMPETITIONS WITH 50+ CONTESTANTS (OR OVER 200 AT NATIONALS!), IS CONSISTENT STUDYING. PREPARING BY TAKING PRACTICE TESTS, JUDGING CLASSES. AND STUDYING INTENSIVELY IS ESSENTIAL. THE CONTEST COVERS A VAST RANGE OF HORSE-RELATED TOPICS, FROM GENETICS AND REPRODUCTION TO ANATOMY,

EQUIPMENT, DISEASES, BODY SYSTEMS AND MORE. THE NFDA SCHOLARSHIP ALLOWED ME TO INVEST IN A HORSE JUDGING COURSE FROM TEXAS A&M, WHICH GREATLY IMPROVED MY JUDGING SKILLS AND CONTRIBUTED TO OUR RESERVE TEAM RANKING. THANK YOU SO MUCH TO THE NFDA, AND TO MY 4-H EXTENSION AGENTS, KELSEY IRVINE AND GRACE CARTER FOR THEIR SUPPORT.

REGIONALS 2024'

I WAS FORTUNATE ENOUGH TO QUALIFY FOR REGIONALS THIS YEAR IN TRAINING LEVEL. PERSEPHONE (PERCY) AND I HAVE HAD A TON OF UPS AND DOWNS DURING OUT DRESSAGE JOURNEY, SHE IS A HIGH STRUNG ENERGETIC RESCUE WHO CAN BE EXTREMELY HARD TO TRAIN, BUT WITH THE HELP FROM MY BRILLIANT TRAINER SUSANNE GRAHAM WE HAVE COME SO FAR THIS YEAR AND GOING TO REGIONALS WAS THE TIP OF THE ICEBERG FOR US. OUR GOALS FOR 2024 WERE TO GET OUR RIDES AWARDS IN TRAINING AND FIRST LEVEL, AND OUR FIRST LEVEL SCORES TOWARDS A FUTURE BRONZE MEDAL WHICH WE ACHIEVED. REGIONALS WASN'T REALLY ON THE WISH LIST TILL I GOT MY FIRST SCORE AT CANTERBURY. GOALS FOR 2025 ARE TO HOPEFULLY GET OUR SCORES FOR RIDERS AWARDS AND USDF BRONZE MEDAL IN SECOND LEVEL, BUT WE HAVE NO RUSH AND DEFINITELY NEED TO TAKE OUR TIME AND LOTS OF LESSONS FROM SUZANNE. REGIONALS WAS SUCH AN AMAZING EXPERIENCE. PERCY WAS VERY NERVOUS IT'S IN THE INDOOR ARENA, BUT DID WELL IN OUR FIRST TEST IN THE OUTDOOR ARENA WHERE WE GOT A 4TH PLACE. THE CHAMPIONSHIP WAS SUNDAY AFTERNOON AND I WAS THE LAST RIDER OF THE CLASS. PERCY WAS VERY NERVOUS, I WAS CLOSE TO SCRATCHING BUT KNEW IF I DIDN'T GET HER CALMED DOWN AND WORKING THROUGH HER NERVES, IT WOULD BE VERY HARD TO GET HER BACK IN AN INDOOR ARENA AGAIN. WE GOT THROUGH THE TEST WITH LOTS OF TENSION, BUT JUST GETTING THROUGH IT WAS A HUGE WIN FOR US BOTH. IT WAS WONDERFUL TO SEE ALL THE OTHER FAMILIAR FACES FROM NFDA AND

EVERYONE HAD SUCH GREAT RIDES. I AM NOT QUITE SURE I'LL TRY FOR REGIONALS AGAIN IN 25' SINCE IT'LL BE IN CONYERS GA, IT'S A FAR DRIVE, BUT IF IT'S BACK AT WEC IN 26' WE'LL DEFINITELY TRY AGAIN. FOR NOW, WE ARE VERY EXCITED ABOUT GETTING READY FOR DRESSAGE ON THE FIRST COAST, AND MY DAUGHTER FREYA WILL RIDE PERCY AT NFDA. THANK YOU SO MUCH NFDA FOR THE SCHOLARSHIP TOWARDS REGIONALS. SUCH AN AMAZING EXPERIENCE.

Our Mission
